<u>Clinical manifestations of children and adolescents with anxiety disorders with and without</u> specific learning disorders

Anxiety disorders (ADs) are common among children and adolescents and frequently co-occur with specific learning disorder (SLD). Approximately 20% of children with SLD meet criteria for ADs, while those with anxiety are six times more likely to have a premorbid SLD. The strong relationship between premorbid SLD and ADs underscores the importance of examining developmental trajectories and manifestations of neuropsychiatric conditions like ADs, particularly when SLD is present.

Obsessional thinking and autistic traits are each uniquely associated with greater traits of gender dysphoria in clinical and nonclinical adult samples

Research has demonstrated a strong relationship between autism and gender dysphoria (GD) and that this relationship could be explained by obsessional interests which are characteristic of autism.

<u>Supporting caregivers: Enhancing parental well-being through resources for autism care in</u> school-based family counselling

Despite the rise in autism diagnoses and the growing need for parental support, few studies have examined how a sense of control reduces distress. This study explored relationships between social support, sense of control, stress, anxiety and loneliness among parents of children with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD), with implications for school-based family counselling.

<u>Digitally enabled, self-referral as an effective approach for young autistic people to access support: pilot study</u>

Limited resources in health and social care and long waiting lists for autism assessment are resulting in high numbers of autistic people not being adequately supported. We sought to explore the feasibility and effectiveness of meeting this support need through an end-to-end digital self-referral and digital mental health service.

Caregiver burden and familial impact in Down Syndrome Regression Disorder

Down Syndrome Regression Disorder (DSRD) is an acute or subacute neurocognitive regression in individuals with Down syndrome (DS), characterized by a loss of previously acquired cognitive, adaptive, and social skills. DSRD profoundly affects individuals' ability to engage in activities of daily living, making them highly dependent on their caregivers who must provide significantly more support than before the DSRD diagnosis.

<u>Pubertal developmental, body mass index, and cardiovascular autonomic function in children and adolescents with and without autism spectrum disorder: a four-time point accelerated lonaitudinal study</u>

The Autonomic Nervous System (ANS) regulates 'automatic' functions such as heart rate, and alterations may have significant impacts on health outcomes. Cardiovascular measures of autonomic function such as heart rate variability are of interest as biological markers in autism spectrum disorder (ASD). The interplay between the ANS and physical health establishes a need to examine cardiovascular autonomic functioning in youth with and without ASD over development.











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## <u>Confirmatory factor analysis of an identity questionnaire Among autistic adolescents and young adults</u>

Challenges during the transition to adulthood affect how adolescents and young adults (AYA) with autism integrate their autism diagnoses into their self-concept. A positive autism identity is crucial for their psychological and social well-being. This study examined the suitability of the Illness Identity Questionnaire (IIQ) for assessing autism identity by assessing its construct validity and internal consistency among 102 autistic AYA (12–25 years).

## Acceptability of a Novel Parent-Mediated Executive Function Intervention for Young Children With Down Syndrome in Italy

People with Down syndrome (DS) are predisposed to challenges with executive functions (EF), which are crucial for adaptive outcomes and academic success. Early interventions targeting EF are therefore critical. The present study analysed Italian data on the acceptability, enjoyability and household implementation of EXPO (EXecutive function Play Opportunities), a novel caregiver-mediated intervention designed to strengthen EF skills in young children with DS.

## <u>Female reproductive health trends and autism spectrum disorder prevalence between 2000</u> and 2024

This study investigates the correlation between female reproductive health parameters and Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) prevalence from 2000 to 2024. The analysis used advanced statistical and machine learning models to identify trends in key reproductive indicators and their association with ASD prevalence.

## Abnormalities in brain complexity in children with autism spectrum disorder: a sleeping state functional MRI study

The theory of complexity loss in neurodivergent brain is widely acknowledged. However, the findings of autism research do not seem to align well with this theory. We aim to investigate the brain complexity in children with ASD (Autism Spectrum Disorders) compared with the TD (Typical Developed) children in sleeping state.

## Altered processing of consecutive changeable emotional voices in individuals with autistic traits: behavioral and ERP studies

Similar to individuals with autism spectrum disorder (ASD), individuals with autistic traits are expected to exhibit alterations in emotion recognition. However, many previous studies using single emotional stimuli did not observe these alterations in such individuals. Given that consecutive changeable emotional stimuli are more common in social interactions than single emotional stimuli, impaired mental processing of consecutive changeable emotions may be a key factor underlying the social interaction challenges faced by these individuals.

## <u>A randomized controlled trial of the effects of dog-assisted versus robot dog-assisted therapy for children with autism or Down syndrome</u>

Research with controlled or crossover designs in animal-assisted therapy have largely used control groups receiving no treatment or treatment as usual, which can potentially inflate the effects of these interventions. It is therefore not always clear whether this type of therapy has a positive effect on, for example, the social skills of children with special support needs.

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#### Number of autistic people in mental health hospitals: latest data

The latest monthly Assuring Transformation NHS Digital data shows that in February 2025:

- In total 2,055 autistic people and people with a learning disability are in inpatient mental health hospitals in England
- 1,460 (71%) of these people are autistic
- There are 215 under 18s in inpatient units that are autistic or have a learning disability. Of these, 96% are autistic.
